## **Home Testing**

The QR code for this is below and it will also be on our school website. We will also email a link to you. You can use the same QR code / link to report each test result.



## **Face Masks**

Just a reminder that for a limited period the government is advising that students of secondary age and their teachers should wear masks in lessons as well as in corridors and other communal spaces. **We will be adopting this guidance until the end of term and expect all students to wear a mask on school transport and then bring a second mask for use in school.** If students are medically exempt from wearing masks please contact us in advance. Face coverings should be plain and appropriate for use in school. Hub students do not need to wear masks and nor do their teachers.

## **Routines**

Some of our routines are still not back in place because of COVID restrictions. Students arriving in the morning are being offered breakfast, but they will have this in their classrooms. Students arriving in the afternoon will be offered a cereal bar.

Squash will be offered at breaktimes but in order to support social distancing this will be given in classrooms just before Lesson 3 begins.

Lunch is now being eaten in the Dining Halls with students being kept in their bubbles and supervised closely.

## Key Stage 3 News

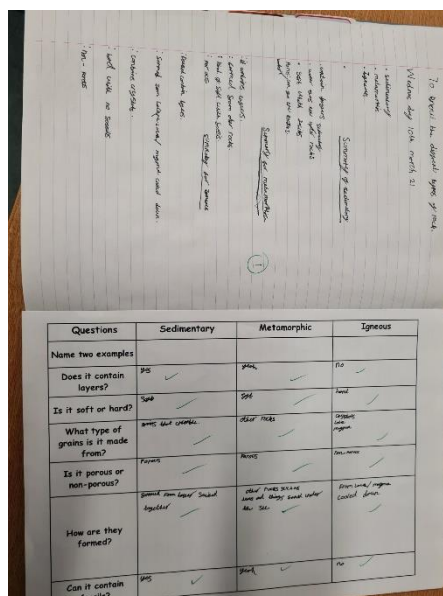
### Ferrari
